Dear Inspector General Fine,

This concerns a verified 137-page complaint that I filed on December 13, 2010 regarding misconduct at the FBI. I sent the complaint to the Investigations Division pursuant to the instructions on your office's website.

I have written to the OIG hotline and Investigations Division seeking information on the status of my complaint. However, I have not been able to obtain a response.

The complaint alleges nine counts of misconduct against five employees of the FBI for their falsification of investigative records and other criminal or dishonest acts. The complaint is supported with documentary evidence from the FBI's own files. The complaint raises important issues implicating the FBI's "core values," especially that of Integrity. Further, the complaint shows violations of the Merit System and the FBI's own policies by a component of the FBI's Security Division. In addition, the complaint exposes failures in the FBI's system of discipline, including deficiencies that were supposed to have been rectified years ago after the famous Bell report on the FBI's Office of Professional Responsibility.

It is my sincere hope that the complaint will be investigated. I enclose an electronic copy with this letter for your review. Would you possibly consider directing the Investigations Division to initiate an investigation?

On another note, I read that you are departing your office later this month. You have had a distinguished term as Inspector General, and I wish you all the best.
