      I, George Ku, declare:
20
      1. I am the Attorney in Fact for Weichiao Ku and Pi Lien Kuo who are
21
      the Plaintiffs and the surviving parents of Decedent Alice Ku. The

      facts contained within this declaration are true and of my own

      personal knowledge except those statements made pursuant to my

      information and belief and as to those statements, I believe them

     to be true. I submit this declaration in support of the Plaintiffs'

     Opposition to Mr. Herchen's Motion for Summary Judgment.

2. The Decedent is my sister, Alice Ku, who was born December 2, 1982 in Taoyuan, Taiwan but was until her death a resident of Santa Clara County, California and a United States citizen. We believe Alice died in Taiwan between November 26 and November 30, 2019. We have a large family. Alice is the youngest and her siblings are:

George Ku (myself), born September 29, 1981; Josephine Ku, born November 13, 1972; Diana Ku, born March 7, 1975; Grace Ku, born April 30, 1976; Monica Ku, born April 24, 1978;

- 3. Alice grew up in our family home in Los Gatos and graduated from Saratoga High School in 2001. Alice graduated from Santa Clara University in 2006. In 2006, after Alice graduated from college, our parents moved back to Taiwan, where they still reside, because our dad developed prostrate cancer and needed surgery. After college Alice started a successful tutoring business. Although not triggered by any particular event and because all siblings have our individual careers and livelihoods as adults in different cities, following her graduation from college, Alice began to distance herself from myself and her sisters with the exception of Josephine who always kept in very close contact with Alice.
- 4. Josephine's final contact with Alice was on November 26, 2019 (California time, it was November 27 in Taiwan) when Josephine received her last text message from Alice following a routine text message exchange. Alice and Josephine exchanged text messages nearly every day in November 2019 and the messages from Alice abruptly stopped on November 26. In early December 2019 our family learned that Alice had missed several tutoring sessions when Grace was

contacted by the parent of one of Alice's students who reported several missed tutoring sessions which had never happened in the several years they had known Alice.

5. After myself and our sisters were unable to contact Alice, on December 9 2019, I called the Sunnyvale Department of Public Safety and asked them to make a welfare check at Alice's apartment located at 665 Kirkland Drive in Sunnyvale. Sunnyvale DPS reported back that Alice had not lived at that apartment for six months. On December 10, I filed a missing persons report with the Sunnyvale Department of Public Safety. That case was assigned to DPS Officer Matthew Sutterfield, badge number 11675, who opened DPS case number 19-10485. That same day I retained Andrew Watters who is an attorney who also conducts investigations. In conjunction with the investigation Mr. Watters filed a Petition for Conservatorship of a Missing Person which was filed on December 19, 2019 in Santa Clara County as case number 19-PR-187385.

6. Mr. Watters located a new address at 1725 Wright Avenue, #172, Mountain View. On December 12, Mr. Waters and I went to the Wright Avenue apartment. Nobody was home but a sign was posted on the door which read "Welcome Home Alice, I love you." I reported that information to Sunnyvale DPS who transferred the case to the Mountain Police Department (case number 19-08703). I met with the apartment complex manager, Bruce Trott, who confirmed Alice lived at the apartment but had not been there for several days. Mr. Watters and I also spoke to several neighbors and learned that Alice lived with her husband, Harald Herchen, an older gentleman who lives

primarily in Palo Alto. Prior to that time we had not been aware that Alice was married or in a relationship with Mr. Herchen. We later learned Alice married Mr. Herchen, who is twenty-three years her senior, on October 6, 2017 (Mr. Herchen's prior wife died on June 3, 2017).

7. On December 18, 2019, Mr. Watters interviewed Mr. Herchen.
According to Mr. Herchen: Alice and Mr. Herchen travelled to Taiwan together on November 23 with an intended return date of December 1; On November 29, Alice travelled alone by train to visit her parents at their home near Taipei; On November 30, Alice sent an email to Mr. Herchen asking him to postpone her return flight to December 7; Mr. Herchen did so, then he travelled back to Taiwan to meet Alice on December 7 but was unable to connect with her; The following day he flew back to California, alone.

8. After Mr. Watters spoke with Mr. Herchen, I talked to Mr. Herchen by telephone. Mr. Herchen told me that Alice often accompanies him on business trips and she often stays a few extra days; He told me that Alice had been looking into tours and that she might be on a tour; He told me he was able to connect with Alice by email and she had a SIM card that allowed her to make local telephone calls; He told me that Alice has access to his credit cards and has been using one of them.

9. On December 19, we learned Mr. Herchen hired a lawyer, James Reilly. The Defendant thereafter refused further contact with myself, my family or Mr. Watters. Mr. Reilly works for Summit Defense, a criminal defense law firm. He only takes criminal cases

and specializes in serious criminal matters.

10. We learned from interviewing neighbors that Alice and Mr.

Herchen often fought loudly. The arguments centered on money and

4

Alice threatened to end the marriage. Alice and Mr. Herchen argued

5

over a pregnancy.

11. With the permission of our family, on December 21, 2019, Mr.

7

Watters circulated his missing person report to the Federal Bureau

of Investigation; the Mountain View Police Department; the American

9

Institute in Taiwan which acts as the United States Embassy and the

10

Criminal Investigation Bureau or CIB, Taiwan's National Police

11

Agency.

12. The Mountain View Police reported Alice to the United States
Department of Justice National Missing and Unidentified Persons

Systems (NamUs). Alice was assigned case number MP67671. I am

15

informed and believe that NamUs has substantial resources and access

16

to information and databases that are not available to police

17

departments or non government organizations. NamUs is able to access

18

DNA and fingerprint databases, to coordinate with the FBI and law

19

enforcement agencies across the country. They have access to

20

immigration records, embassy records, financial records and offer

investigative support including forensics, fingerprinting, DNA, and

dental and medial record identification. To my knowledge they have

24

been unable to find any credible evidence related to Alice's location after she was last heard from on November 29, 2019.

13. My family and I posted paper fliers throughout Palo Alto, Los

Altos, Mountain View and the surrounding area. Similar fliers were

28

posted in both English and Mandarin in Taiwan. We posted missing persons information on various websites and created a Facebook missing persons post that was shared more than a thousand times by users in Taiwan and in the United States. Based on the efforts of myself and my family, Alice's disappearance received substantial media attention in Taiwan on the television, in news papers and on digital media. It was our intention to create as much publicity as possible to hopefully turn up information that would lead us to Alice or explain her disappearance. We offered a reward of \$1,000,000.00 Taiwan Dollars. I contacted ICS World, a private investigation firm with global coverage and investigators in Taiwan. ICS informed me that Taiwan CIB has access to the closed circuit tv and security cameras throughout the country and would be notified if Alice were spotted because of their advanced facial recognition programs. Taiwan CIB has had no facial recognition hits. Despite these efforts, there has been no credible trace of Alice since November 29, 2019, other than the email Mr. Herchen claims to have received.

14. Alice informed her students before she left for Taiwan that she would be gone for two weeks and booked appointments for the first week of December, which she missed. After not hearing from Alice, at least one concerned parent filed a missing person's report which reported Alice missing to their local police agency. Alice's long time esthetician, Brenda, filed her own missing person's report with law enforcement after Alice missed her first appointment in ten years.

15. After I was appointed Alice's conservator, I learned that Alice failed to pay her credit card bill in December 2019 for the first time in her life. She did not use her credit card or access any of her bank accounts following her disappearance. I reviewed all of Alice's financial records and she did not make any large or regular cash withdraws prior to her disappearance. It does not appear that she was stockpiling cash which would allow her to live for a prolonged period of time without leaving a financial footprint. It does not appear she brought any significant, amounts of cash with her to Taiwan. Since Alice has disappeared there has not been any electronic trace of her, either through electronic communications or electronic financial transactions, other than the email Mr. Herchen claims he received from Alice on November 30, 2019. 16. Officer Loo of the Mountain View Police Department, who was assigned to the missing persons case, was able through Chase Bank to track Alice's credit card purchases. The last purchase was on November 23, 2019 at the Napa Farms Market at the San Francisco Airport. There have not been any subsequent transactions. Officer Loo is on a real time queue with Chase that triggers a notification if Alice's card is used. There have been no triggers in the past three years.

17. Our parents, Weichiao Ku and Pi-Lien Kuo, never had plans to see Alice in November or December 2019. They did not know Alice was in Taiwan and did not speak to her while she was in Taiwan (despite Mr. Herchen's claims). Alice had never been to my parent's current Taiwan residence and was not familiar with the area.

18. As the Santa Clara County Superior Court appointed me Alice's Conservator, it was my responsibility to take control of all of Alice's finances and personal possessions, both to safeguard them and also to help determine what had happened to Alice. Mr. Herchen had opposed my petition for conservatorship and attempted to have himself made Alice's conservator. He was therefore aware of my role as the Conservator and required to cooperate. Not only did Mr. Herchen fail to cooperate, I have learned that he purposely did not return at least four of Alice's computers and electronic devices. He paid someone to hack into them, acquired the electronic data and then had the electronic devices destroyed. (Herchen Deposition 2 -274:17-278:22) He turned some of this information over to us as part of the discovery in this case, but we have no way of knowing how much material he did not turn over and whether or not Alice has more personal information and items that Mr. Herchen has retained but not returned to us.

19. Due to the above information as well as the inconsistencies related by Mr. Herchen including: His claim to me in December 2019 that he had spent substantial money and time trying to locate Alice when he later testified he had done nothing; That he said Alice sometimes stayed for more days on trips, but in fact she had never done so according to Taiwan customs and immigration records (which means it would be abnormal for her to choose to stay behind); That he said Alice had enough money with her to support herself for months without working even though she had not withdrawn cash before the trip nor has she used her bank accounts or credit cards since

she left California; That the Defendant said he saw Alice using his card which is a claim that the Defendant has not been able to substantiate; The Defendant stated that he did not know the name of the hotel where he and my sister stayed because the hotel did not have an English name, but in fact the hotel has a French name "Hotel Le Champs Hualien" which is spelled in the English alphabet and should be recognizable to him. That he returned from Taiwan on December 1, 2019 with his arm in a sling and told different people different stories related to his injured arm; That he moved out of the apartment he shared with my sister in 2020 within a few months of Alice being gone; That within a year of Alice disappearing he had a new girlfriend who now lives with him; That his second wife (Alice was his third) died under mysterious circumstances in June 2017 within three weeks of the time he originally claimed to have met Alice; That he lied under oath when he testified about he met Alice and we still do not know when or how they met, I believe Mr. Herchen killed my sister Alice Ku and then sent an email to himself from his hotel to try to create an alibi. 20. This belief was reinforced when Google, through a subpoena,

20. This belief was reinforced when Google, through a subpoena, provided the unique IP address where that email originated and Taiwan CIB, who has been investigating, confirmed the unique address was of the hotel where Mr. Herchen stayed that same evening. To our knowledge, after confirming with subject matters experts, this unique IP address is unique to that hotel and cannot be replicated (Please see the Declaration of Dr. Levian). Additional suspicious, deceptive and alarming activity by Mr. Herchen includes: He wrote

me an email on January 9, 2020 (attached as Exhibit "A") claiming he spent "considerable sums in getting Alice to come back." He denied sending that email in his first deposition and testified that if he sent such an email it would be false. He admitted sending the email in his second deposition and admitted he exaggerated his efforts to find Alice, which were none, which he also admitted; He later testified that he did not search for Alice because that was her family's responsibility; He could not or would not provide a reasonable explanation for hiring an experienced criminal defense lawyer as soon as Alice was discovered to be missing by her family.

I declare under the penalty of perjury of the laws of the State of California that the foregoing is true and correct and if called to testify as a witness, I could and would testify competently thereto.
