

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JUDGMENT

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The matter of *Buckley v. Control Line Electric, et al.* came on for court trial on September 21, 22, and 23, 2015 before the Honorable Socrates Manoukian. The Court filed its Statement of Decision on March 16, 2016, and this Judgment followed.

On the complaint for fraud, breach of fiduciary duty, and other relief, the Court finds in favor of Plaintiffs Michael Buckley and Amy Buckley and against Anthony Voroshuck, Mark Voroshuck, and Control Line Electric, Inc., as set forth in the Statement of Decision. Defendants, jointly and severally, shall pay two hundred ten thousand dollars (\$210,000) in special damages. Defendant Anthony Voroshuck shall pay one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) in punitive damages, for which Control Line Electric, Inc. is vicariously liable. Defendant Mark Voroshuck shall pay one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) in punitive damages, for which Control Line Electric, Inc. is vicariously liable. Plaintiff Michael Buckley shall return his 25,000 shares in Control Line Electric, Inc. to the corporation within thirty days. Defendants shall return \$17,340.30 in insurance proceeds to Mercury Insurance and clear the title on the truck they reported as stolen, both within thirty days. In addition, Plaintiffs are entitled to indemnity (1) on the SBA loan taken out by the parties, (2) on any negative consequences of the repossession of the Control Line Electric truck discussed at trial, and (3) on any subrogation action now or in the future maintained by the carrier who paid out benefits to Defendants on the truck they reported stolen.

On the cross complaint, the Court awards judgment to Cross Defendants Michael
Buckley, Amy Buckley, and Bay City Electrical Contractors, Inc., and against Cross
Complainants Anthony Voroshuck, Mark Voroshuck, and Control Line Electric, Inc., as set forth in the Statement of Decision. Cross Complainants shall take nothing on their cross complaint.

Michael Buckley, Amy Buckley, and Bay City Electrical Contractors are the prevailing
parties on the complaint and cross complaint, and shall recover their costs from

Defendants/Cross Complainants in accordance with a properly served memorandum of costs.
